From Mike Fennema (Laos)

Taking a moment to provide an update and praise report on a number of the prayer requests I shared with you in mid April:

- Myo Myo, Moe Moe's younger sister, who was planning to donate a kidney to Mi Mi, their older sister, when suspected cancer was identified on the kidney, was recently in Thailand for additional testing which showed that the growth on the kidney, which was removed, was not cancerous. Wow, an incredible answer to prayer. She is now recovering from the operation and plans to return soon to Myanmar.
- Mi Mi has found a potential second donor and is now back in India to move forward with steps for the kidney transplant.
- Maria arrived here in Laos, a week later than our original booked flight. We had some unexpected adventures along the way (challenge with contacting the embassy regarding getting the required visa stamped in the passport, challenges with getting a PCR test - the courier did not send it in time, testing positive for covid, etc). Anyway, that is all in the past and we are very excited to have her at home with us.
- Tha Tha, our nephew, continues to adjust to a very different educational approach (IB - International Baccalaureate).
- Matthew recently received an acceptance letter from the university he was most interested in. Earlier he did receive letters from several other universities. Now he needs to make a final decision about where and what to study!
